I know, I said my 1978 Easter letter was my last. I lied. Earenting never ends. I told nother I would venture one more effort. She said, "Time, but be brief! So, I'll try.

The theme of the Cld Teastament is not irrelevant today. It elaborates the quintessential model of all human life. Thy do some get it and some not? It seems as though salvation lies outside yourself end, indeed, it does. It lies with Christ. And our job, simply, is to submit our will to Ms. SUBMISSION is the KEY!
